STUDENT SPOTLIGHT

Synchronized Skating

Synchronized skating is a rare sport. We are 2 out of about 34 kids in Sussex County that do Synchronized Skating. Synchronized Skating (Synchro) is a team sport. We are part of the New Jersey Black Diamonds. We skate at Skyland's Ice World in Stockholm, NJ. Synchronized skating is a team of 8-20 skaters. Synchronized Skating means completing the required elements, and doing them at the same time. Our team the New Jersey Black Diamonds is split into 3 levels. Synchronized Skating has 14 levels. You start at beginner and work your way up. Our 3 teams are beginner, preliminary, and the highest level at our rink is Pre-Juvenile. We are on Pre-Juvenile. Synchronized skating has many elements including: The line, pinwheel, circle, traveling circle, slice, creative element, and the block. Synchronized Skating is a competitive sport. You can earn gold, silver, bronze, and pewter.

Believe it or not synchronized skating is not an Olympic sport! We hope it will in 2022.

We started skating in Kindergarten at the age of 5. In 3rd grade the skating director of Skyland's asked us to join Black Diamonds. We were thrilled! Our team started as beginner, we won many silvers and bronzes. No gold!

Our second year, we skated at the Beginner 1 level. Hannah was chosen to be team captain. About 2 weeks later, the skating director asked Hannah to join the highest level team, Beginner 2. Heidi was made team captain of the Beginner 1 team. We skated at the same competitions just different times, levels, makeup, and costumes. We skated at Hershey, West Orange, Massachusetts, and Connecticut. At Hershey, Hannah's Beginner 2 team ended up getting the first gold in Black Diamond history! The coaches were so proud! Heidi's Beginner 1 team earned bronze and pewter.

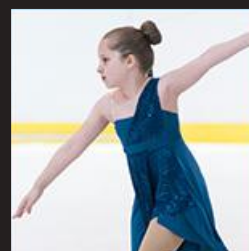
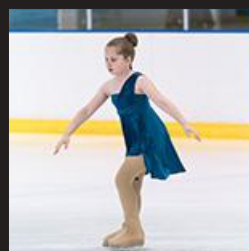
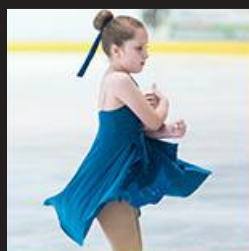
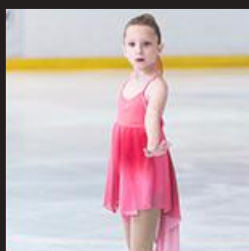
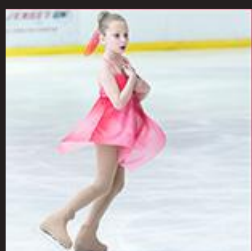
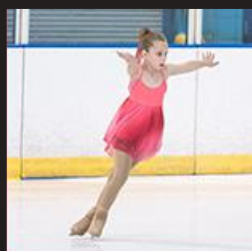


In the third year, Heidi was moved up to Hannah's team which was now skating higher at the Preliminary level. We got an international choreographer to put together our program. We were going to Easterns!

Easterns are skating against all the Synchronized teams on the East Coast, at our level. It was in Virginia. We ended up placing 9th. We tried our best!

This year is our fourth year. We are now at Pre-Juvenile level. We are skating to Thriller by Michael Jackson. So far we skated at West Orange, and Connecticut, both times we got 2nd place. The first competition in West Orange Heidi couldn't skate because she broke her toe, but by the 2nd competition it was healed and she was able to skate! We are skating at Easterns again. This time they are in Hershey Park, PA and we are skating against 27 teams. We hope we will do better this year! If our team earns gold, silver, bronze, or pewter we will advance to Nationals! At Nationals, we would skate against the top 4 teams at our level from the Mid-Western, and the Pacific-Coast, which would be fantastic!

SCHOOL SPOTLIGHT

A CHANGE IN FOCUS Student Centered Approach Infusing Authentic Learning Opportunities

The Math Department has been working toward implementing our Common Core Standard based curriculum using student centered learning while providing authentic learning opportunities. To this end, we have spent professional development time with David Ginsburg. David Ginsburg has served over 20 years as a math teacher, instructional leader, and PD provider. He leads a Philadelphia-based team of consultants that specializes in instructional coaching, leadership coaching, and common-core implementation.

The use of "Grappling Problems" is one activity the department has implemented immediately. These activities cause the students to struggle, however, they develop their resilience to work together and find a way to solve a problem. Students are showing growth in their ability to collaborate, listen to other's ideas, and use their resources.

Another challenge we have put into action is working together with our STEM Department to infuse Mathematics into our STEM projects and curriculum - continuing to connect math to real-life skills and their application.

As a department, we continue to take every opportunity offered to help our students succeed!
