Myslinki's vision, ELA teachers worked very hard, over the summer, on incorporating flexible (or alternative) seating into those rooms. This means that when students are working they do not have to sit at their desks. Instead, they have the freedom to find comfortable spaces around the room to work. This can include kneeling, standing, sitting in a traditional desk, working on carpet squares, leaning on a pillow with a clipboard, sitting at a table with a stool, or working on a bench. There are many possibilities of what this can look like in a classroom.



Although these classrooms look very different from the classrooms most parents are used to seeing, research shows that students are able to focus and do their best work when they are comfortable.
